

Dedicated on October 21, 1869, it was one of Tennessee's first Confederate monuments. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977.

Longstreet-Zollicoffer Camp # 87 continues to be one of the largest Camps in the entire SCV Confederation. N.B. Forrest Camp # 3 in Chattanooga, under the leadership of Commander Steve Troxler started 2016 with their annual Lee-Jackson Banquet at the Doubletree Hotel. SCV Executive Director Michael Landree presented a very motivating program to the well-attended event. Camp # 3 participated in the Dalton Civil War show in February resulting in the recruitment of several new members. Under the supervision of Camp Adjutant Herb Deloach, work continued throughout the year at the historic Chattanooga Confederate Cemetery, as the Camp wrapped up an extensive maintenance/restoration project costing over \$20,000. Confederate Memorial Day was held in conjunction with the dedication of three Confederate headstones. Families attended from Michigan, Alabama and Florida. The discovery of the longlost grave of black Confederate soldier Shadrick Searcy made local news headlines. Camp # 3 assisted with the Children of the Confederacy's national meeting in Chattanooga, resulting in a visit of over 200 children and adults to the historic Chattanooga Confederate Cemetery. Camp members attended the dedication of the Chickamauga, GA Confederate Soldier monument in November. The N.B. Forrest Camp # 3 will host their annual Lee-Jackson banquet on Saturday evening, January 21, 2017 at the Double Tree Hotel. Tennessee Division Commander James Patterson will be the speaker.





# **Debutantes Invited**

If you know of a young lady, perhaps daughter, granddaughter or niece, who is a descendant of a Confederate veteran, and is eligible to be a Southern Debutante, we would like to invite her to participate as a Deb at the 2017 National Sons of Confederate Veterans Reunion.

This will be July 19-22, 2017 at the Sheraton Downtown Hotel and involve a number of activities for the girls and her parents and family. The Grand Ball for the Debs will be Sat, July  $22^{nd}$  in the Ballroom of the Memphis Convention Center.

#### Debutante Qualifications:

A Debutante must be a descendant of a Confederate soldier, never been married or had a child(ren), cannot be engaged, must be between 16-23, be sponsored by a camp or division, and has not been previously presented at a NATIONAL SCV reunion.

It is not required that the father have Confederate lineage, just the deb. In a past case a deb's father was a first generation American, and his parents came from Germany. The mother was from the South and had Confederate ancestors. Dad was an associate member of the camp that was sponsoring her and the brothers were members of the SCV. In another case the dad was not even in the picture for whatever reason and the pastor was the one who had recommended the young lady to participate. She participated.
